- September-December: Network Meetings -



After the Network approach kicked-off in early summer, the second round of network meetings are taking place in the fourth quarter of the year. A main agenda point is the target setting! Find out more on our website.

- October: P2P Learning Session -

A peer-to-peer learning session was organized by Energy Cities on the topic "Organising & facilitating the local transition through multi-actor engagement processes in cities". It aimed to discuss necessary elements to organize such a process, particularly with regard to local governance and to the diversity of stakeholders involved in the reflections and decisionmaking processes.

- November: Project Meeting -



After 15 months of working together remotely due to the Covid-19 pandemic, the project meeting -although held virtually- was a very special time. We experienced great team spirit and got inspired and motivated to keep up the good work!

The second day of the meeting was open to all active members of the PATH2LC networks and was supplemented by a virtual site visit.

- January 2022: Training on Tools -

Project activities have revealed a strong need for municipal stakeholders to understand the basics of heating and cooling planning. This lack of knowledge was identified as one of the reasons why high impact measures, like the energy-efficient refurbishment of buildings, have still not been planned. Therefore, a training on tools and methods for heating and cooling planning will be offered for municipal stakeholders in January 2022. Municipal stakeholders will learn about the saving potential held by heating and cooling planning, the basic calculations and data used in the process. They will also learn about some success stories of municipalities that have engaged in heating and cooling planning.

The first year of the project provided an opportunity to promote mutual understanding. We as a project team wanted to understand how we could support the municipalities in the implementation of their SECAP measures. The municipalities wanted to understand what our project is about and how they could benefit from the "Learning Municipality Network" approach.

1st step: analysis and assessment of existing SEAPs and SECAPs in the municipalities.

2nd step: data collection to have a starting point for the monitoring within the PATH2LC project.

3rd step: interviews with the network operators and decision-makers of each participating municipality to find out about their needs. Find out more in the <u>published paper</u>.
